Frances Henne Award

Sponsored by the American Association of School Librarians (AASL) a division of the American Library Association (ALA) and Libraries Unlimited

Overview

The AASL Frances Henne Award recognizes a school librarian with five years or less experience who demonstrates leadership qualities with learners, educators, and administrators. The award provides a stipend for the recipient's first-time attendance at an AASL National Conference or ALA Annual Conference.

Eligibility

- 1. The applicant shall be a current AASL personal member.
- 2. The applicant shall be currently employed as a school librarian at the building-level and have from 1-5 years experience as a school librarian. School library experience should not exceed 5 years.
- 3. The applicant shall have no previous attendance at an ALA Annual Conference or an AASL National Conference.

Criteria

All applications for the grant will be judged against the following criteria:

- 1. Quality of purpose statement.
- 2. Content of professional statement.
- 3. Professional statement style.
- 4. Potential for future leadership.

Rating

- 1. AASL Member (5 points)
- 2. School Library Practitioner (5 points)
- 3. Purpose Statement (5 points)
- 4. Professional Statement Content (5 points)
- 5. Professional Statement Style (5 points)
- 6. Leadership Potential (5 points)
- 7. Years of Service (for comparison only)
