Whereas, the American Library Association (ALA), the International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA), and the broader academic library community lost a valued member and colleague with the untimely death of Wanda V. Cole on November 23, 2018;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole received a B.A., magna cum laude, in Classics from Lawrence University, a M.A. in Classics from Tufts University, and a M.S. in Library Science from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole held numerous positions at academic libraries in the United States, culminating her career as Dean of the Ottenheimer Library at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole also served as the Interim Director of Library Services at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole was active in ALA for many years, having served on several ALA committees, as well as having been elected to several terms on ALA Council;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole was active in IFLA for many years, having served as a Section Chair and on the IFLA Professional Committee and the IFLA Governing Board;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole was a regular participant and contributor at the Crimea International Library Conferences;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole was a highly regarded speaker at many national and international conferences and the author of several professional publications;

Whereas, Wanda V. Dole was active in her local Episcopal church, traveled the world, maintained a deep love of opera, was known for her impeccable taste in everything, and charmed her friends and colleagues with her delightful personality, now, therefore be it
