The title of the program, held on Saturday July 8, was "Collaborative Cool: Partnerships that Produce." Russell L. Lewis Jr. (Acting Co-President and Andrew W. Mellon Director for Collections and Research) began the program with an overview of the Society's varied holdings. He discussed the changing mission of the Society which is a privately endowed institution devoted to collecting and interpreting the rich heritage of Chicago. Lewis described several recent collaborative projects, including the "Great Chicago Fire" web site. An "Encyclopedia of Chicago History" is currently being produced in partnership with the Newberry Library.

EBSS Committee Reports Most Committees met July 8, 2000, 9:30 am—12:30 pm

Curriculum Materials Committee Jeannie Kamerman, University of West Florida, Pensacola, FL

Current projects for the CMC include a Web Page of Curriculum Library Web sites useful to CMC librarians. In addition, the roster of current Webliography assignments was reviewed. They include Assessment / Educational Tests - Judy Walker; Associations Agencies and Organizations - Yvorme Roux; Children's and Young Adult Literature - Arm Brownson; Early Childhood Education - Judy Druse; Education Administration - Judy Walker; Educational Foundations - Dorothy Schleicher; Educational Statistics - Judy Druse; ESL / Bilingual Education - J. Kamerman & John Hickock; Electronic Journals - Perny Beile; Instructional Technology - J. Kamerman; Lesson Plans Teaching Activities - A. Brownson; Multicultural Education - Verta Silins; National Standards - J. Walker; School Counseling & Psychology - Trish Lenkowski; Special Education - Dermis Kreps.

Ad Hoc Committees were discussed. Nancy O'Brien reported that to date there are 75 institutions listed in the Test Collections Directory, which will be sent to the Publications and Communications Committee in mid October. Chairs of the other Ad Hoc Committees include Gary Lare, CMC Management; Fred Olive, CMC Directory Committee; CMC Standards and Guidelines, Ann Brownson. Pat Libutti, Cybrarian with Think Quest, explored how electronic resources are integrated in CMC Collections.

Instruction for Educators Committee

Instruction for Educators Committee Doug Cook, Shippensburg State University, Shippensburg, PA

The committee's primary task for the next year is to complete an article entitled, "When may a child be counted as a six year old?" This article will review web sites where education-related statistics can be obtained. Scott Walter is acting as the Project Director for the article, which has the approval of the EBSS Publication Committee. As a start for the article, Sarah Beasley put together an excellent list of web sites that have potential to be included. Much of our meeting time was spent discussing audience, format and evaluation standards. The following statistical categories were assigned and will become the rough outline for the article: data sets, fast facts, meta sites, state K-12 sites, practitioner sites, international sites, webliographies, advocacy groups, higher education, Statistical Abstracts, and National Center for Education Statistics. The committee plans to have a first draft of the article by Midwinter 2001.

Membership & Orientation Committee Nancy O'Brien, chair pro-tem; University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, IL

The Committee discussed the ACRL Strategic Plan, as well as the EBSS New Chair Orientation. Suggestions for the meeting included the following points: A model agenda should be developed that lists each speaker by role. In the fittire, this session should be called the EBSS New Leader Orientation to indicate that new committee chairs and officers should attend. N. O'Brien volunteered to compile results of the evaluation forms. In March of each year, a reminder about the new leader orientation session should be sent to speakers and membership and Orientation Committee members. The session should also be amounced via the EBSS listsery. Procedures outlining the arrangements for the new leader orientation session should be placed in the EBSS Orientation Manual on the Web.

Psychology & Psychiatry Committee Brian Quinn, Texas Tech University, Lubbook, TX

Juanita Benedicto, the committee's Liaison to Division Two of the American Psychological Association submitted a report on the Society for the Teaching of Psychology / ALA Joint Interest Task Force, which Brian Quinn distributed in her absence. The Task Force has set up a listserv, and has posted a copy of the Information Literacy Standards on its web site along with a call for input. Members of the Task Force eventually hope to publish a book about ways of incorporating library assignments into psychology course work. They plan on adding a high school teacher and a school librarian to the Task Force in hopes of involving more high school teachers of psychology.

Carolyn Gosling, reporting for APA, distributed copies of new pricing for the Psyc INFO database which will become effective October 1, 2000. Psyc LIT will be merged into the Psyc INFO database and the Psyc LIT name will be retired. APA has created a Full-text Article Database which will be launched in the Winter of 2000.

There is a new psychology database still under construction, called E-Psyche. It is produced by a company called Database Access Group in Albuquerque, NM, and plans to index 4200 psychology journals, compared with PsychINFO's coverage of 1500. Gary Momillan, of The American Psychiatric Association Library spoke briefly about his institution. Resources are being added to the WEB; a new version of DSM-IV will be published soon. The URL for this organization is www.psych.org.

Publications & Communications Committee Ted Wygant, Daytona Beach Community College, FL

Committee members reported updates on publication projects for liaison responsibilities. New liaisons for outgoing committee members were decided. Julie Cumningham will serve as liaison to histruction for Educators and Ted Wygant will serve as liaison to the Ad Hoc Management of Curriculum Materials Centers. The committee discussed various EBSS committee publication projects. Liaisons will share suggestions regarding publication projects with committees for review and discussion. Newsletter Editor Update: Helga Visscher will work with two volunteers interested in the Newsletter position. Judy Walker will assist in this effort. Further discussion will continue at MidWinter. Judy Walker has developed Listsery guidelines. This document will be shared with committee members in early fall. Further discussion and finalization of draft will be accomplished at MidWinter.

Reference Service & Resources Committee Julie Tharp, Arizona State University Tempe, AZ

At our Midwinter meeting, we had discussed a possible project that involves identifying education journals falling into the categories of "peer reviewed," "juried," or "refereed." The committee had decided that requesting a searchable field in ERIC citations for this information would be the best approach. Since our last meeting, Janice has contacted Ted Brandhorst at the ERIC Processing and Reference Facility about the feasibility of adding such a field and has shared his correspondence with the rest of the group. Brandhorst assured the group that our suggestion would receive "the consideration," but he did have some questions.

We hope to bring in someone from ERIC for the Midwinter meeting. Ted Brandhorst seems a logical choice.

> Social Work / Social Welfare Committee Sally Lawler, Wayne State University, Detroit, MI

Kate Corby helped the Committee critique its Web page. We were encouraged to use the EBSS Listserv and CSWE Newsletter to promote it, to post changes, and to recruit other library instructional web pages. We discussed moving from initial "selected web sites," to having more criteria and definition of scope and purpose (examplary sites). We decided that each page needed to be revised and updated by a member of the committee. The collection development policy needs to be related more specifically to competencies.

Cindy Pierre shared trends going on at the University of Kansas in the Current Topics Discussion. She shared the results of a survey she did that confinmed that professors are reluctant to use class time for computer skills. Consequently UK decided to have required workshops during Orientation Week.

The committee shared other strategies that work: Survey incoming students re computer skills, and then team students with fewer computer skills with students who are more skilled. Have the librarian correct exercises. Have skills tied to an assignment. Assess and evaluate what we do in library instruc


tion. We decided to add tips for assessment and measuring outcomes to our web page. Some members volunteered to give Cindy's survey to their own faculty. We made specific assignments for improving and developing the web page.

Ad Hoc Management of Curriculum Materials Centers Committee

Jo Ann Carr, University of Wisconsin Madison, WI

Jo Ann distributed the draft manuscript and asked committee members to review for overlaps in coverage, identification of additional material to be addressed, identification of authors of additional information and style and format considerations. This review should be completed and results sent to Jo Ann by August 15. Allison will send a revision of her and Lorene Sisson's chapter to Jo Ann for distribution. The abstracts for each chapter should be 2-3 sentences for inclusion in the Table of Contents. Two areas for additional information identified by committee members are the Assessment of Collection Development Policy and Inclusion of ecurriculum. Judy will also be sending her chapter to Jo Ann for distribution to the committee.

The suggested charge for the Ad Hoc Committee for Digital Publication of the CMC Management Guide was reviewed and revised: To extend the work of the Management of Curriculum Materials Centers Committee by developing a parallel Internet based publication. This publication should include the content of the print title and supplement it with case studies of CMC's, links among the articles in the management guide, links to CMC's and other related organizations and supplementary materials.



Ad Hoc Committee to Revise the CMC Directory Fred Olive, University of Alabama-Birmingham, AL

Fred Olive reported that the survey for the Directory had been approved. Hugh Thompson of ACRL publications will post on the Web Site after details for another ACRL Eproject have been finalized. Fred expects the survey will be available at the beginning of the Fall Term. He requested that Committee members send him lists of curriculum materials centers. Others reported regarding the CMC Directory: For Publications Committee, Francine DeFranco and for the Ad Hoc Committee on Management of Curriculum Materials Centers, Chair, Jo Ann Carr. The committee "signed off" on the draft after a few editorial type changes.

The 4th edition was used as a basis to divide the work of solicitation of participants. John Hickock volunteered his student assistants to check other sources for additional CMCs. The chair is compiling a web page of those CMCs that have web pages to broaden the scope of the Directory. The chair will draft a "tall for participation" for the 5th edition of the Directory. The committee will then send these to their list of participants when the input web site is ready. Hugh Thompson said that he would contact us when the site is ready.

Ad Hoc Committee on the Test Collection Directory P. Fehrmann, Kent State University, OH and N. O'Brien, University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, IL

Paul Fehrmann and Nancy O'Brien welcomed members to the sixth meeting of the Ad Hoc committee. The Committee members reviewed progress of the directory. Paul Fehrmann distributed copies of selected sections for review. Discussion about the content and layout of the Introduction included the following points: The section of further sources of information should be amnotated. Annotations should include a scope note and purpose of the source. Assignments to create amountations were made, with

each individual responsible for a specific reference source.

The following timeframe was agreed upon to insure completion of the directory by early fall, with submission to the EBSS Publications and Communications Committee by October 15, 2000. Send completed annotations to Nancy by July 15. All corrections, annotations, and any additional information regarding directory entries will be sent to Cheryl by August 15. She will distribute the revised directory to committee members by September 15. Comments and corrections will be due to her by October 1. The final version of the directory will be sent to the EBSS Publications and Communications Committee by October 15.
