- Networked school libraries and fully licensed school librarians have a positive impact on student learning and achievement.
- Students learn 21st century learning skills through state-of-the-art school library media programs.
- Interactions with a school library media specialist aid children and teens in becoming confident, competent, and independent learners.
- Students achieve more academically when their teachers and fully licensed school library media specialists collaboratively plan and deliver instruction.
- There is data to support these statements, which has been collected over the past decade in studies across the United States.
- Stimulus money (ARRA) can be spent to benefit school libraries and to hire fully licensed school librarians in every school building, e.g., Title I; Enhancing Education Through Technology; and State Fiscal Stabilization Funds.
