



The Freedom to Read Foundation (FTRF) was established in 1969 as the First Amendment legal defense arm of the American Library Association. FTRF is the only organization in the United States whose primary goal is to protect, promote, and defend the First Amendment in libraries.

FTRF supported the students' landmark challenge in *Island Trees v. Pico*, in which the U.S. Supreme Court found a school district's removal of books unconstitutional.

FTRF helped overturn the Communications Decency Act, which would have restricted freedom of speech online.

FTRF assisted Denver's Tattered Cover Book Store in its successful fight against a search warrant targeting customer records. The Colorado Supreme Court ruled that such warrants pose a grave threat to the First Amendment.

FTRF aided residents of Wichita Falls, TX in their effort to keep the books *Heather Has Two Mommies* and *Daddy's Roommate* freely available in the public library.

FTRF helped ensure that the Cedarville, AR school district's ban on *Harry Potter* books was overturned.
