Picture Books

Hall, Michael. *Red: A Crayon's Story*. 2015. 40p. Greenwillow, \$18.89 (9780062252098). 3-7 yrs.

The label reads "Red." However, all of Red's strawberries and hearts come out blue. Friends and family try to fix Red until new buddy Berry helps this crayon discover his true color.

Herthel, Jessica & Jennings, Jazz. *I am Jazz*. 2014. 32p. Dial. \$17.99 (9780803741072) 3-7 yrs.

From the time she was two years old, Jazz knew that she had a girl's brain in a boy's body. This confused her family until they took her to a doctor who explained that Jazz was transgender and that she was born that way. Jazz's story is based on her real-life experiences and is told in a simple, clear way that will be appreciated by picture book readers, their parents, and teachers.

Kilodavis, Cheryl. *My Princess Boy*. illustrated by Suzanne Desimone. 2010. 28p. Simon & Schuster, \$17.99 (9781442429888). Gr. K-3.

A four-year-old boy loves dressing up in princess clothing. "A nonfiction picture book about acceptance ... to give children and adults a tool to talk about unconditional friendship"--Dust jacket.

Juvenile Fiction

Clark, Kristin. *Freakboy*. 2013. 435p. Farrar Straus Giroux, \$18.99 (9780374324728). Gr. 7-12.

Told from three viewpoints, seventeen-year-old Brendan, a wrestler, struggles to come to terms with his place on the transgender spectrum while Vanessa, the girl he loves, and Angel, a transgender acquaintance, try to help.

Gino, Alex. *George*. 2015. 195p. Scholastic, \$16.99 (9780545812542). Gr 3-7.

When people look at George, they see a boy. But she knows she's a girl. With the help of her best friend, George comes up with a plan, not just so she can be Charlotte in her school play

but so everyone can know who she is, once and for all. Stonewall Book Awards—Mike Morgan & Larry Romans Children's Award Book.

Merey, Ilike. *A + e 4ever: a Graphic Novel*. 2011. 214p. Lethe Press, \$18.00 (9781590213902). Gr. 9-12.

Asher Machnik is a teenage boy cursed with a beautiful androgynous face. Guys punch him, girls slag him and by high school he's developed an intense fear of being touched. Art remains his only escape from an otherwise emotionally empty life. Eulalie Mason is the lonely, tough-talking dyke from school who befriends Ash. The only one to see and accept all of his sides as a loner, a fellow artist and a best friend, she's starting to wonder if Ash is ever going to see all of her in this graphic novel set in that ambiguous crossroads where love and friendship, boy and girl, straight and gay meet..

Polonsky, Ami. *Gracefully Grayson*. 2014. 243p. Hyperion, \$16.99 (9781423185277). Gr. 4-7.

Twelve-year-old Grayson, through a school play, finds the courage to reveal a deep truth: in spite of being seen as a boy, she knows for a fact that she's a girl.

Juvenile Nonfiction

Andrews, Arin. *Some Assembly Required: the Not-So-Secret Life of a Transgender Teen*. 2014. 248p. Simon & Schuster \$17.99 (9781481416757). Gr. 8-12.

Seventeen-year-old Arin Andrews shares all the hilarious, painful, and poignant details of undergoing gender reassignment as a high school student in this winning teen memoir.

Brugman, Alyssa. *Alex As Well*. 2015. 224p. Henry Holt, \$16.99 (9781627790147). Gr 9-12.

Fourteen-years-old and intersex, Alex was raised by her parents as a boy, but she knows she is a girl. Taking her identity into her own hands, she stops her testosterone pills and starts over at a new school. This presents a whole new set of challenges, from facing down disapproving parents to navigating her legal rights.

Cronn-Mills, Kristin. *Transgender Lives: Complex Stories, Complex Voices*. 2014. Twenty First Century Books. \$34.65 (9780761390220). Gr. 7-9.

Offers a look into the lives of transgender people and how they came to better understand, accept, and express their gender identities.

Kuklin, Susan. *Beyond Magenta: Transgender Teens Speak Out*. 2014. 182p. Candlewick Press, \$12.99 (9780763656119). Gr. 7-12.

Author and photographer Susan Kuklin interviewed six transgender or gender-neutral young adults, writing about them thoughtfully and respectfully before, during, and after their personal acknowledgment of gender preference. Each honest discussion and disclosure, whether joyful or heartbreaking, is completely different from the other because of family dynamics, living situations, gender, and the transition these teens make in recognition of their true selves.

Pohlen, Jerome. *Gay & Lesbian History for Kids: The Century-Long Struggle for LGBT Rights, with 21 Activities*. 2015. 192p. Chicago Review, \$17.95 (9781613730829). Gr. 4-9.

From ancient China to the 2015 U.S. Supreme Court decision on marriage equality, this narrative history reference gives context to the challenges and achievements of both queer individuals and the broader quest for civil rights.

Silverberg, Cory. *Sex is a Funny Word: A Book about Bodies, Feelings, and YOU*. Written by Cory Silverberg; illus. by Fiona Smyth. 2015. 159p. Seven Stories, \$23.95 (9781609806064). Gr. 3-6.

For children with questions about bodies, gender, touch, sex, and love, this all-inclusive book guides the conversation between children and trusted adults in an accessible graphic format. Gentle, intelligent humor brings home the message of respect, trust, joy, and justice for everyone's body. Stonewall Book Awards–Mike Morgan & Larry Romans Children's & Young Adult Award Honor Book.

Testa, Rylan Jay. *The Gender Quest Workbook: a Guide for Teens & Young Adults Exploring Gender Identity*. 2015. 169p. Instant Help Books. \$16.95 (9781626252974). Gr. 7 and up.

This one-of-a-kind, comprehensive workbook will help you navigate your gender identity and expression at home, in school, and with peers.
