Defining Data Competencies

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Defining Data Competencies

What are the five data competencies?

Planning & management

- Define the problem or question
- Plan to collect data that will answer the question
- Plan how to curate and manage collected data

Research methods

- Choose a research method (case study, observation, historical, longitudinal . . .)
- Design instruments/protocols (survey, interview/focus group questions . . .)

Analysis

- Apply statistical skills to data sets
- Use data analysis software
- Read and create charts and graphs

Decisions & assessment

- Draw conclusions from survey data
- Use data to revise/create library programming
- Frame an array of data points to set a baseline or present context

Advocacy & storytelling

- Define your goal and audience
- Choose the right data and find hidden insights
- Select effective visualizations to communicate a compelling story

Important because:

Libraries want to collect useful data and store it for the future

Libraries want to collect valid data in an ethical manner

Libraries want to understand the data we collect

Libraries want to use our data to create positive change

Libraries want to use data to convince others to support us

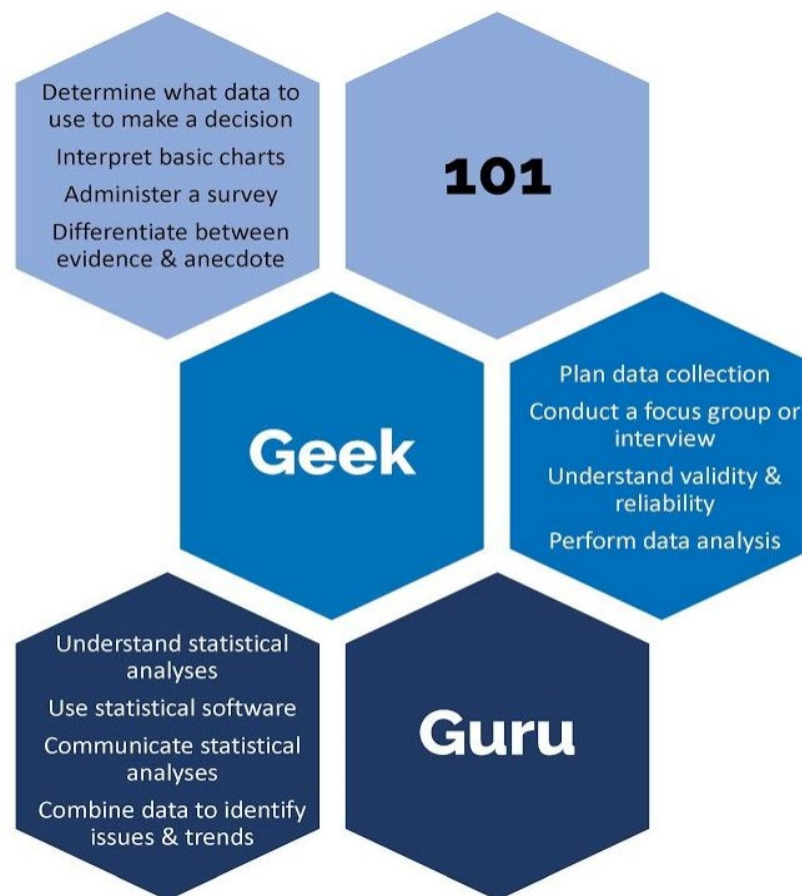

Levels of Expertise

If you've never worked with data before, but want to start...

Data 101

- Determine what data to use to make a decision
- Interpret basic charts
- Administer a survey using templates, such as Project Outcome
- Understand the difference between an anecdote and evidence

Levels of Expertise

If you've worked with data before, but want to increase your skills...

Data Geek

- Design a data collection instrument (survey, interview guide, etc.)
- Conduct a focus group or interview
- Understand the concepts of validity and reliability
- Demonstrate knowledge of government datasets
- Perform basic data analysis using common software

Levels of Expertise

If you've worked extensively with data, but want to refine your skills...

Data Guru

- Understand various statistical analyses such as regression
- Conduct statistical analysis using software, e.g. SPSS or R
- Enable others to understand the results of statistical analyses
- Combine data from various sources to identify issues and assess trends

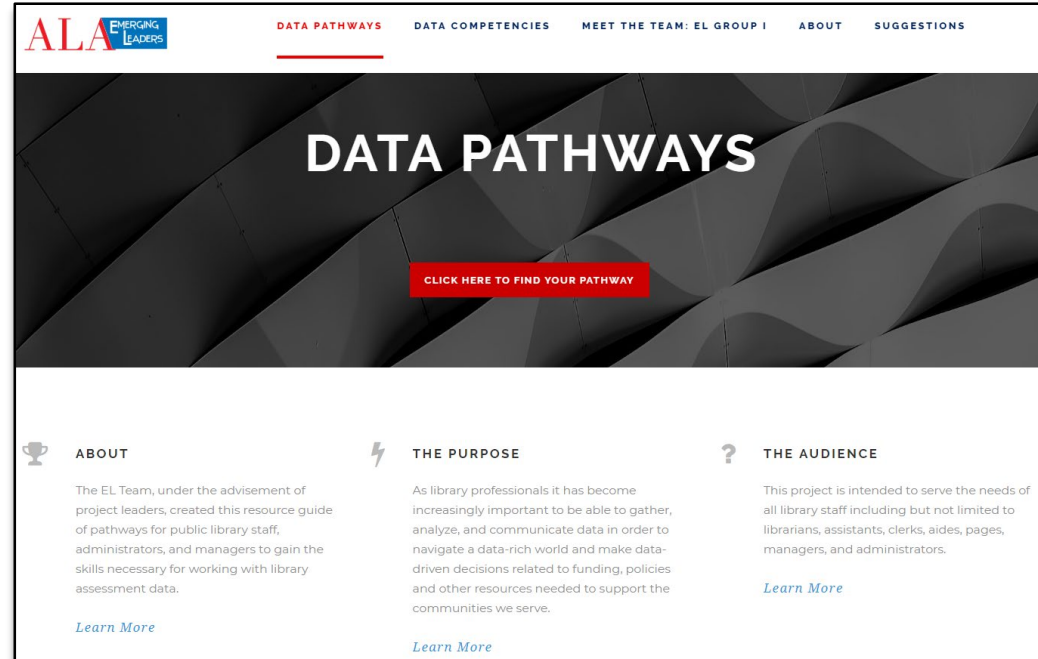


