

**Fall Executive Committee Meeting  
October 25 – 26, 2015, Chicago**

**Topic:** Prioritizing Futures Report Next Steps

**Background:** In January 2014 YALSA released the report “The Future of Library Services for and with Teens: a Call to Action.” The report calls for libraries to make significant changes in the way they think about, plan, deliver and evaluate teen services. YALSA leaders will want to determine a strategy for embedding the report recommendations into the work of YALSA.

**Action Required:** Discussion

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**YALSA’s Futures Report: What Do We Do Now?**

*The Future of Library Services for and with Teens: A Call to Action* has been out now for almost a year. YALSA has begun to implement strategies to address the needs identified in the report. The two main questions for the board to consider are: 1) What should YALSA be doing as an organization to realign itself so that it is better suited to support the changes called for in the report and 2) How can we keep moving forward supporting members as they try to adopt the changes in the report?

The YALSA Director has compiled a working document (see below) detailing what has been done since January 2014 when the report came out as well as some things that we may want to consider for the future. Each item on the document needs to be exploited in as much detail as possible. Additional actions can be added where the board deems they are needed. In order to do that, we could consider using an outcomes-based approach, which has been used in education for a number of years. **Possible issues to explore:**

- Creating permanent change in the dialogue of all stakeholders surrounding library services to teens

- Providing and evaluating the effectiveness of professional development designed and promoted by YALSA which relates to the Futures Report
- Creating a widespread awareness and in-depth knowledge of areas not previously considered by library staff to be relevant to their jobs, such as:
  1. expanding definitions of multiple literacies
  2. shifts in demographics and cultural competency of library workers as well as teens
  3. new media literacy issues
  4. connected learning
  5. workforce development training opportunities
  6. needs of teens in non-traditional spaces
- Finding ways to promote the importance of relationships and giving guidance and suggestions for how to do that.

**Questions to consider:**

Do we want to organize ourselves to do outcomes-based planning in order to leverage what we need to do in the future with what has already been done with the Futures Report?

What are our goals?

What kind of additional research do we need to do? Formal? Informal? Do we need to rethink some of the questions in our survey?

Can we learn from what some libraries are already doing? How would we gather that information?

How should we focus our professional development opportunities?

How will we know that our actions have been effective?

How do we **prioritize** all of the opportunities for further action which are presented in the Futures Report?

What is the role of action research in helping to create a common language and a pervasive culture encompassing the paradigm shift in providing library services to teens? How do we promote and support action research?
