coordinator and staff to highlight our recently renovated space and all of the cool things teens could do there. I quickly realized there were other ways the library could impact this program. Without a library on site, the students didn't have access to curriculum supporting resources or materials for pleasure reading. I worked with staff to develop a 'rotating collection' with items related to classroom topics as well as high-interest titles and native language materials. As our partnership developed, we added monthly outreach, bringing hands-on learning to students in an after-school club.

At the start and end of the school year, students take field trips to the library, learning about services they can access for free - for some, it's their first time in a library and many are amazed by resources they can access at no cost.
