Whereas Bernadette Storck was highly respected and admired for her teaching and mentoring students and colleagues.

Whereas she was an administrator at the Tampa-Hillsborough (FL) Public Library System and Leon County (FL) Public Library;

Whereas Bernadette Storck served as president of the Florida Library Association and organized the Pinellas County (FL) Library Cooperative, serving as its first director;

Whereas she established and curated the archives of the Florida Library Association, held at the University of South Florida (USF) Tampa Library, and served as an adjunct faculty member for the USF School of Information;
