Whereas Adonna Fleming was a dedicated librarian and researcher in Geographical Information Systems (GIS);

Whereas she received her undergraduate and graduate degrees in journalism, geology, and library science from the University of Arizona;

Whereas Adonna served more than 17 years at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln University Libraries as the Math and Geology Librarian, was fully promoted to professor in 2014, and retired in 2021;

Whereas Adonna received the Best Paper Award from the Geoscience Information Society (GSIS) in 2013 for "The Ogallala Aquifer in Nebraska: Gray Literature 1891-2010." published in the *Journal of Agricultural & Food Information*, 13:3 (2012): 213-239, coauthored with Professors Leslie M. Delserone & Elaine Nowick;

Whereas Adonna served with excellence on local and national library committees; and she was president of the Geoscience Information Society in 2005-2006;

Whereas she was a member and editor of Geoscience Information Society (GSIS) Newsletter (2007-2010) and a faithful member of the North American Cartographic Information Society; NebraskaMap; and other geospatial organizations;

Whereas she taught and inspired students, librarians, and faculty to develop their skills and abilities in GIS tools and technology; now, therefore, be it
