Whereas Alvin Leroy Lee earned his Master of Library and Information Science degree from the University of South Florida;

Whereas Alvin Leroy Lee, through his love for education and lifelong learning, inspired countless students throughout his career;

Whereas Alvin Leroy Lee was an Instructor Librarian specializing in Scholarly Communications and Resource Sharing at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University Libraries, an HBCU located in Tallahassee, Florida;

Whereas Alvin Leroy Lee served as chair of Florida A&M University Libraries' Digitization Committee and was passionate about learning, digital libraries, and digital scholarship; and
