



### **Memorial Resolution Honoring David Goodman**

Whereas the American Library Association (ALA) lost a valued colleague on April 10, 2023, with the death of David Goodman;

Whereas Goodman earned an undergraduate degree in mathematics from Brooklyn College and his doctorate in molecular biology from the University of California Berkeley; Goodman served as an assistant professor of biochemistry at Rutgers; and became a librarian afterward; he received his M.L.S from Rutgers University;

Whereas Goodman worked at Brooklyn College as the general science reference librarian; at Princeton University, Goodman worked as the chemistry librarian, biology librarian, and research librarian and biological sciences bibliographer;

Whereas Goodman joined the faculty at Palmer in fall 2002; he was an associate professor at the Palmer School of Library and Information Science, Long Island University; Goodman was a member of the American Society of Information Science, Sigma Xi; most recently Goodman served as an editor and Wikipedian in Residence at the New York Public Library;

Whereas Goodman published and presented extensively, and his research interests included library user studies, the structure of scientific information, and e-journal publishing; Goodman was a friend, colleague, and mentor to many; now, therefore, be it
