Basic Subject Cataloging Using LCSH

an ALCTS/PCC Workshop

This two-day workshop presents the full subject analysis training program developed by subcommittees of the ALCTS Subject Analysis Committee (SAC) and the Program for Cooperative Cataloging (PCC) Standing Committee on Training. Presented by John Mitchell, this workshop benefits catalogers at all levels and individuals involved in the education and training of catalogers.

Electronic Serials Cataloging

an ALCTS/Library of Congress SCCTP Workshop

This one day course is designed as a hands-on training course for cataloging electronic serials distributed through the Web. This workshop is based on Anglo-American Cataloging Rules (AACR), 2nd edition. Presented Margaret Mering, this course incorporates key revisions of Chapter 9, "Electronic resources" and Chapter 12, "Continuing resources" that apply to electronic serials, but is not a comprehensive course on serials cataloging. The course is also based on Library of Congress Rule Interpretations, the MARC 21 format, and CONSER specific policies and practices set forth in the CONSER Cataloging Manual and CONSER Editing Guide.

Integrating Resources Cataloging

an ALCTS/Library of Congress SCCTP Workshop

This workshop is intended for experienced serial catalogers and those who have attended the SCCTP Basic Serials Cataloging class. Margaret Mering will present selected sessions for this one-day course.

Fundamentals of Library of Congress Classification

an ALCTS/Library of Congress Workshop

This two-day workshop presents authoritative training in the principles and practices of Library of Congress Classification (LCC). Includes background on the development and structure of LCC, on the components of call numbers, and guidance in the use of essential tools. Emphasis is on application of LCC in areas most often used by generalists, including schedules H, N, and P. The workshop concludes with a session on local classification decisions and on proposing class numbers through SACO.
