Tim Richards, Program Chair, will moderate a panel of school, public, and university librarians who will discuss the coordination of library instruction programs. The panel will explore specific measures which all libraries can adopt to enhance lifelong learning for their public. Competence in the use of library resources as a result of library instruction in all levels of libraries will be discussed, too.

Several discussions items will be presented to the membership for their discussion and approval:

Priorities for LIRT in 1979/80: Activites of the Continuing Education Task Force will continue. Two new task forces are proposed:

The Task Force on Instruction Theory is charged to develop a theoretical base that relates library user education to educational activities and other societal needs. It will also develop goals and objectives which will provide a framework for library user education which supports formal and informal education.

The National Programs Study Task Force is charged to collect all available examples of library user education programs which are competency based, organized on sequential levels and/or part of a structured curriculum. To analyze, evaulate, and synthesize these examples as a first step toward formulation a national model and/or establish stands for library user education.

Participation in LIRT Task Forces which do specific projects is welcomed. The time framed needed to complete the specific project may be extended. Ad hoc committees are very temporary, appointed when needed by the Steering Committee. There should be a realistic appraisal of the time and commitment required for committee and task force membership. Such participation should mean include attendance at both ALA Mid-winter and Annual Conferences. There should also be a willingness to attend specific meetings called at special times to meet special demands.

The allocation of LIRT resources. As the LIRT membership fee must cover all aspects of the LIRT program, the spending priorities are suggested:

1) Annual Conference Program expenses 2) Newsletter producation and mailing
3) Promotional expenses to increase membership 4) Funding for special activities in a given year and 5) Seed money for the start of self sustaining enterprises. The seed money would be returned.
