Whereas the American Library Association (ALA) and the library community lost a valued member and colleague on June 1, 2020, with the death of Mary Ardeth Gaylord;

Whereas Mary Ardeth Gaylord served in various librarian roles in both the academic and private sectors including Kent State University and Eli Whitney;

Whereas she was a tireless advocate for business librarianship;

Whereas in 1986 she co-founded the Business Reference & Services Section (BRASS) of the then Reference and Adult Services Division (RASD) and served as its first chair in the transition from a discussion group as a place to provide programming and continuing education for librarians providing business reference assistance across a wide range of academic, corporate, and public libraries of all sizes; and

Whereas her professionalism, energy, fashion sense, and joie de vivre were an inspiration to her coworkers and colleagues, and students, now, therefore, be it
