

Photo Frame Make 'n' Take



SUPPLIES:

- Craft sticks (You can also use craft foam, cardboard, twigs, etc.)
- Glue
- Decorating supplies (markers, stickers, etc.)
- Scissors
- Ruler

DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTIONS:

Showcase your family or someone you care about in a handmade frame.

1. Glue 4 craft sticks together to form a square.
2. Repeat step 1 to make a second square.
3. Glue the 2 squares back to back. Leave one side open to insert the picture.
4. Let glue dry completely before decorating with markers, stickers, etc.
5. Use the ruler and scissors to trim a photo to fit inside the frame.
6. Insert the photo into the frame.
7. (Optional) Attach ribbon to the back to hang frame or a sticky magnet to put on the refrigerator.
