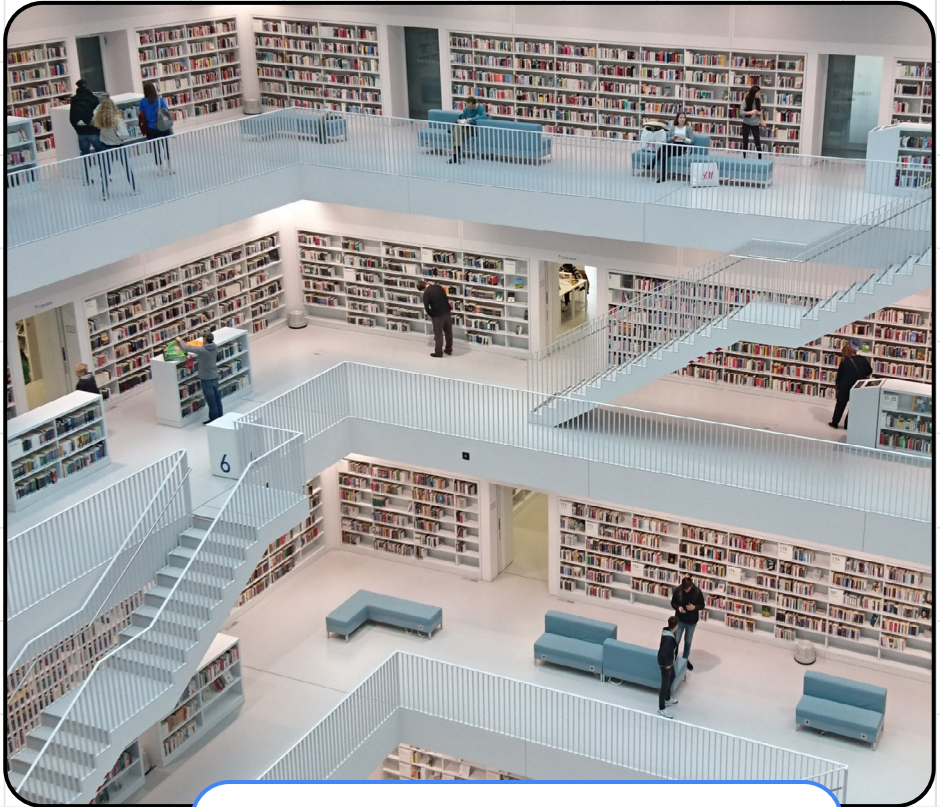

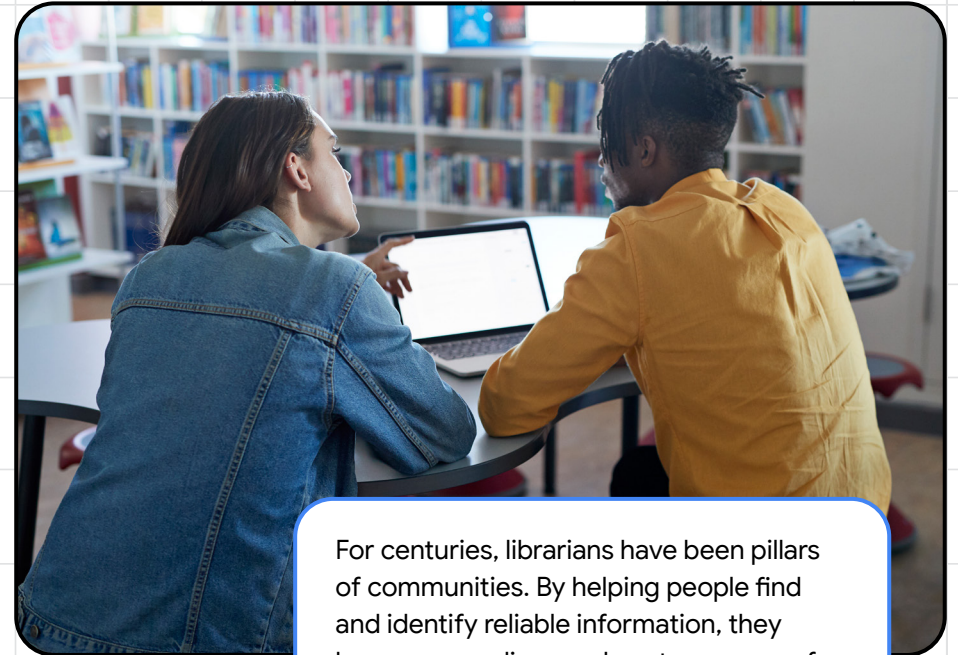

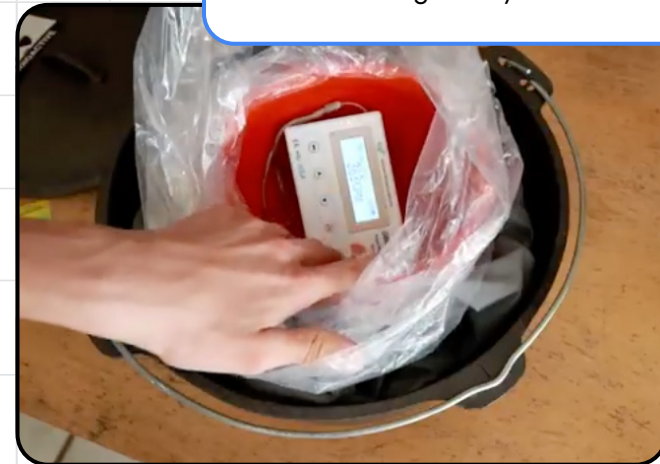

Techniques for better results

Word choice matters

The words you choose when you search help determine the results you get, but it's not always easy to decide which words to use. And sometimes we go too broad — reformulating your question often can help tune your Search.

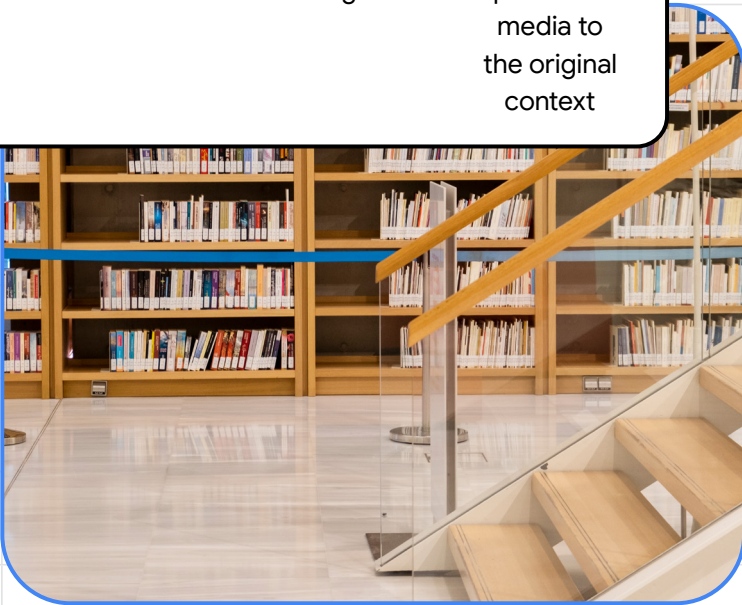
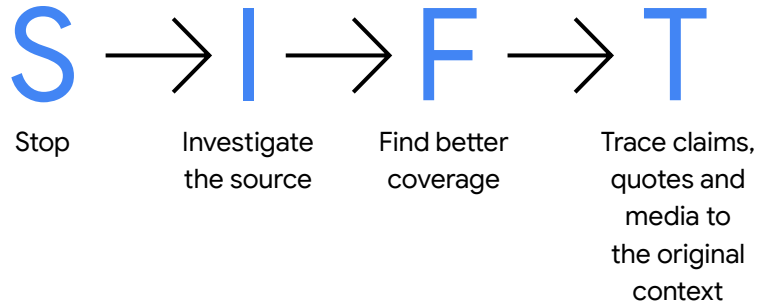

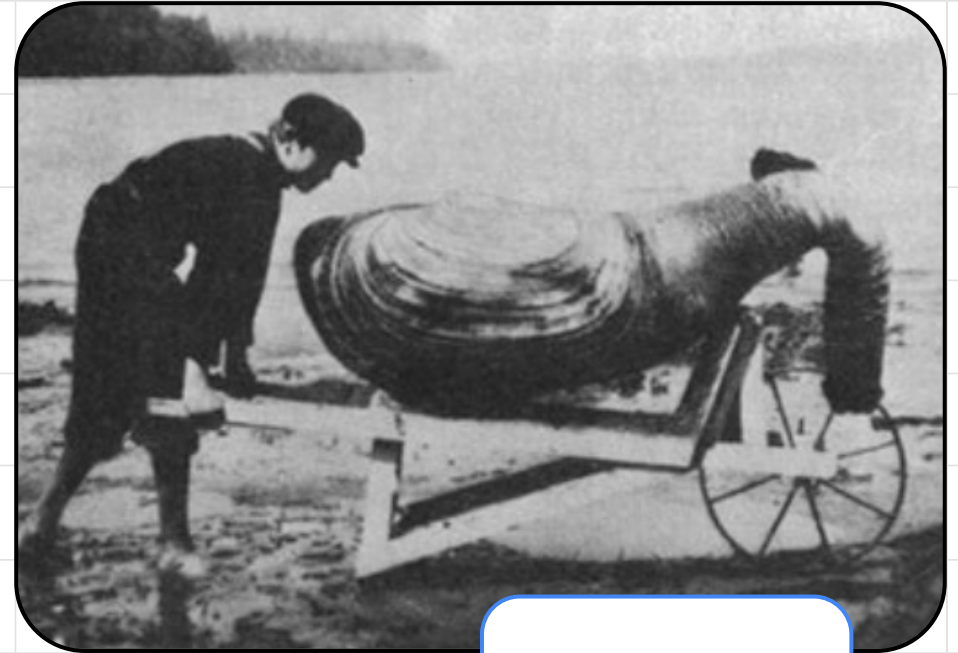

The SIFT method is a framework you can use to improve your information literacy. These four simple steps take you through the basics of quick source- and claim-checking.



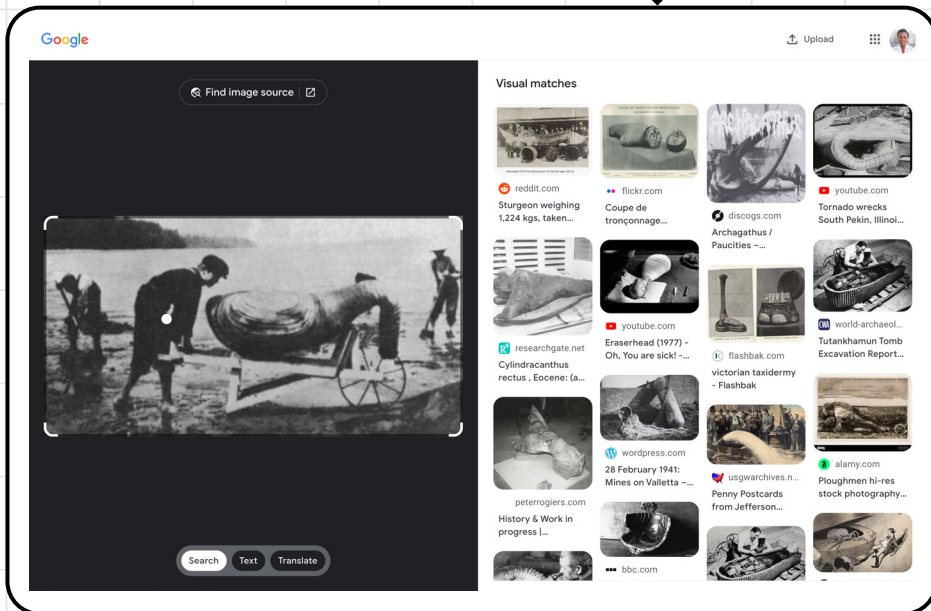
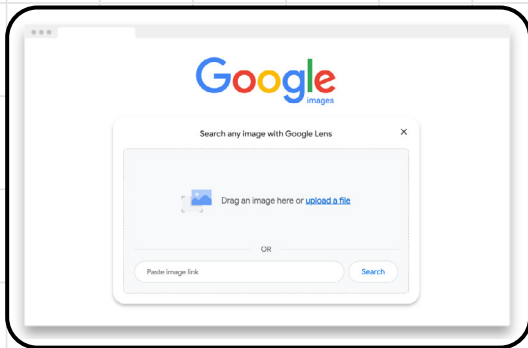

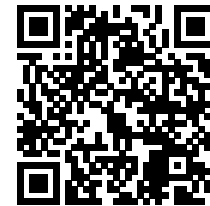
