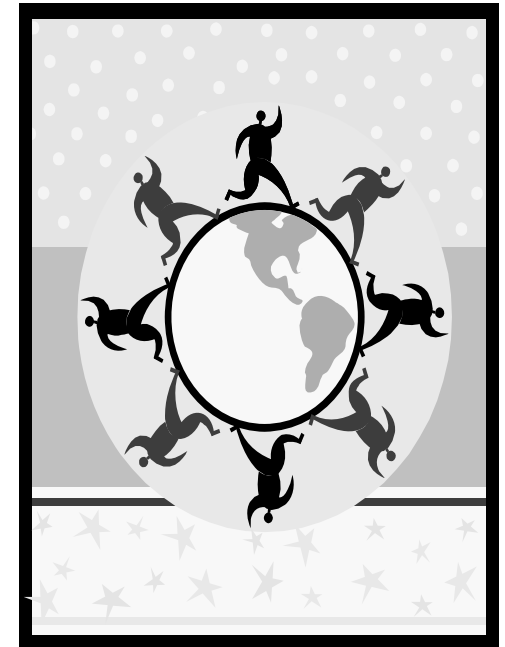

At each ALA Annual Conference and Midwinter Meeting the Resume Review Service has a booth or room in the ALA Placement Center. Members of NMRT volunteer as greeters at this booth, and can help you schedule an appointment to have your resume reviewed, and help you get ready for any interviews you might have in the Placement Center. The reviewers who will see your resume range from library directors to staff development officers to people who have served on many librarian search committees. We try to have a variety of librarians from academic, public and school libraries at each conference to meet the special requirements that each library type may have. If you would like to have your resume reviewed in Seattle, stop by the **Convention Center, Hall E** to make an appointment. This service is available to **anyone** attending the conference.

The E-mail Service

A reviewer has a month to review your resume, and should contact you when they have it completed. The e-mail service is only available to NMRT members.
